Trail Guide - Sales - Val : no update

Natural History – summer weed control

- cheatgrass on Sunflower Hill, exploring goat grazing : short discussion, attendee Kendal Benesh may be a resource for ideas and information (works with EKIVC)

**Trails** - summer maintenance : Ryan McKenzie advises most of work in KNP over summer involved extensive cleaning up of downed trees. Certain projects were pushed back as there was extensive fire treatment programs in place or planned and need to see the scope of cutting before time is put in to new trail building. Also has three more weeks of student work through Stillwater Consulting. They will be tasked to do tree clearing along corridors and hot spots that require work.

- brushing of Eimer's Road, Jimmy Russell : still required, if time allows
- drainage ditches on Jimmy Russell : no discussion
- potential reroutes of Trans Canada Trail, Shapeshifter etc.: extensive discussion regarding possible routes. Of the possible routes discussed the preferred route would be mainly outside of the KNP running up from Mr Toad vs the first proposed route across and above the current Shapeshifter trail and mainly inside the KNP.

**Horse Barn Valley** - Tora Bora climbing crag – report on meeting with RSTBC and climbers: discussion regarding meeting that occured between KNPS, Lisa Cox (RSTBC) and East Kootenay Climbing Association. Cox will be drafting up an agreement with EKCA to manage the climbing crag. KNPS will look into opportunities to educate EKCA and climbers using the crag about rare lichen in the area.

**Events** - report on summer events : Naomi Humenny and Gary Hicks had a booth at the Aug 8th Farmer's Market resulting in a few new memberships and some map sales
